This Month in Republic of Texas History

January, 1836

Currently, Branch, T. Archer, William H. Wharton, and Stephen F. Austin are in New Orleans to solicit money, supplies, and men to fight for Texas independence. The envoys have been met with enthusiasm, but were advised help would not be forthcoming as long as Texians are divided on whether to sustain the Mexican constitution. From New Orleans, the men will proceed to Washington, where Wharton will remain while Austin proceeds to New York City and Archer goes to Richmond.

#### January 26 - Mirabeau B. Lamar Day

On January 26, we honor the Father of Texas Education and second President of the Republic of Texas, Mirabeau B. Lamar. Please fly your Texas flag in his honor on this day.
