April 21 – San Jacinto Day

Following several disastrous battles (including The Alamo), the remainder of the Texas army gathered on the fields of San Jacinto on April 21, 1836, for what would be a final battle with Santa Anna's troops.

Though taken by surprise, the Mexican Army put up some resistance initially for a few minutes then fled in disorder. The Texans asked no quarter and gave none. The slaughter was appalling. But the Texans did show Santa Anna the mercy he denied the men of The Alamo and the Battle of Goliad.



The encounter at San Jacinto has been called 18 Minutes
That Changed The World. It was the decisive battle of the Texas Revolution and eventually led to enormous land concessions from Mexico. Almost one-third of the present area of America changed sovereignty.

This Month In Republic of Texas History

April 21, 1836 San Jacinto, Texas

Today a decisive battle was fought at the mouth of the San Jacinto River. The Texas Army, led by General Sam Houston, routed the Mexican forces of President Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna. The Mexicans lost 630 killed and 730 wounded, and Santa Anna himself was taken prisoner. Texian losses were 8 killed and 25 wounded, including Sam Houston, whose right leg was shattered above the ankle. Secretary of War Thomas J. Rusk would later report "Our army consisted of 750 effective men. This brave band achieved a victory as glorious as any in the records of history, and the happy consequences will be felt in Texas by succeeding generations."
