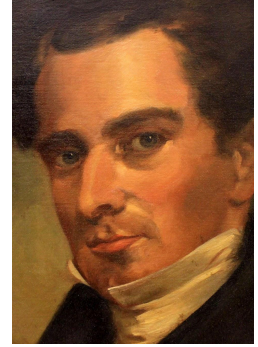

This Month in Republic of Texas History

November, 1837:

This month, the Republic of Texas took a significant step toward establishing

international relations when the first officially recognized foreign diplomat, Alcée La Branche of the United States, presented his credentials in Houston. His arrival marks the formal recognition of Texas independence by the U.S. government, which occurred earlier this year,

and symbolized our Republic's growing legitimacy on the world stage. La Branche's appointment as chargé d'affaires will help strengthen trade and communication between the two nations and encourage other countries to consider diplomatic relations with Texas. This event reflects the Republic's determination to secure its place among independent nations despite ongoing political and financial challenges.

Texas Honor Days:

Stephen F. Austin's Birthday: November 3

Stephen F. Austin (1793-1836), known as the "Father of Texas," was an American empresario who led the first successful colonization of Texas by bringing 300 families from the United States to settle there in the 1820s. He worked tirelessly to secure land grants, maintain peace with Mexico, and promote orderly settlement. Though initially loyal to Mexico, Austin ultimately supported Texas independence and helped lay the foundation for the Republic of Texas.

DRT Founders' Day: November 6

On November 6, 1891, a group of seventeen ladies met in the home of Mrs. Andrew Briscoe in Houston to carry out the idea of Misses Betty Ballinger and Hally Bryan for organizing a Republic of Texas daughters' organization to meet with the Texas Veterans.
