October 2 – Gonzales Day

The first recognized battle of the Texas Revolution was fought in Gonzales in 1836. The Texas force of 160 men challenged the Mexican military by refusing to surrender a brass cannon previously given to the town. The Battle of Gonzales, which gave rise to the *"Come and Take It"* slogan and flag, lasted only a few minutes, but most citizens in Texas realized that there was no turning back. A war had begun.

This Month In Republic of Texas History

Saturday, October 22, 1836

The first constitutionally elected President of the Republic of Texas, Sam Houston, was installed on this day, following the abrupt resignation of interim president. David G. Burnet. Because of short notice, he did not have a speech prepared, but made an impromptu statement. At its conclusion, he eloquently referred to his defense of Texas on the battlefield, and vowed to further defend the new nation if needed with "my blood and my life." Vice President Mirabeau B. Lamar was installed the same day. His inaugural address stated that he did not expect to accomplish much as Vice President, and he hoped that no "unhappy contingency" would arise to require him to assume greater authority."
