[Editor's note: Campbell was unable to attend the April Luncheon and I forgot to include her note in the last newsletter. Blame it on a feeble brain!]




September 16 – Texian Navy Day September 18 – Texas Heroes Day

This Month In Republic of Texas History

September 25, 1839

King Louis Philippe of France signed a treaty of amity, navigation, and commerce with the Republic of Texas.

France was the first foreign country, other than the United States, to recognize the Republic as a sovereign nation. Dubois de Saligny, a secretary in the French legation in Washington, was promoted to Chargé d'Affaires and sent to establish a legation in Austin, Texas. A similar treaty was signed with the Netherlands on September 18, 1840.
