The extremely important thing to remember is to indicate the purpose of the payment (dues, etc.) Zelle is the preferred method for payments—no lost or delated checks, no check to write, no stamp or trip to the Post Office or mailbox. April 21 – San Jacinto Day

Following several disastrous battles (including The Alamo), the remainder of Texas army gathered on the fields of San Jacinto on April 21, 1836, for what would be a final battle with Santa Anna's troops.

Though taken by surprise, the Mexican Army put up some resistance initially for a few minutes then fled in disorder. The Texans asked no quarter and gave none. The slaughter was appalling. But the Texans did show Santa Anna the mercy he denied the men of The Alamo and the Battle of Goliad.

The encounter at San Jacinto has been called 18 Minutes That Changed The World. It was the decisive battle of the Texas Revolution and eventually led to enormous land concessions from Mexico. Almost one-third of the present area of America changed sovereignty.



The San Jacinto Monument was built to commemorate the battle and the Texans' sacrifice (helped by The Daughters of the Republic of Texas who pressured the legislature). The 537.31 ft. monument is the tallest **masonry** column in the world. At the top is

a 34 ft., 220-ton star and observation deck.

While the Monument hosts numerous educational events and activities each year, the surrounding land remains sacred ground to Texans.



We are pleased to announce the winners of this year's scholarship competition. Yes--winner**S**. We had two entries. The scores were so close that the Scholarship Committee decided to award scholarships to both students.

This year's topic, *The Treaty of Bird's Fort*, dealt with the first real treaty signed by the Republic and relations with Native Americans in general—not an easy topic.

**Audrey** is a Senior at Lake Travis High School and plans to attend UT Austin. Even better, she is a Full Member of our chapter. This is the first time we've been able to award a scholarship to a member rather than a relative of a member.

**Campbell** is a Senior at Atascocita High School in Humble, TX. She will be attending Cedarville University in Cedarville, OH. She is the grand-daughter of Associate Member **Muriel Parker**.

Both are members of the National Honor Society and very active in school activities.

### A NOTE ABOUT OUR SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS AND WINNERS
