### This Month in Republic of Texas History:

**Tuesday, February 23, 1836**: **The Alamo siege began today.** Inside the garrison are 150 Texians, determined to defend their position at all costs. Over 1000 Mexican soldiers are gathered, and additional forces led by General Antonio López de Santa Anna are believed to be advancing. The Mexicans have raised a blood-red flag, indicating that no quarter would be given. Sharing the command of the Alamo are Colonel William Barret Travis and Colonel James Bowie.
