#### **FINANCIAL REPORT**



As of February 3<sup>rd</sup>, our balances were:

Checking Account: \$ 5,417.74 Scholarship Fund Account: \$11,528.64

Our checking account is reduced by \$5,000.00 because we are in the process of switching to Chase Bank. That amount was used to open new checking and Scholarship Fund accounts.

The change is for three reasons: 1) It has become increasingly difficult to bank at Capital One; 2) Chase has better services and actual physical banks; and 3) it will enable our new Treasurer, **Milli Pope**, to better serve the chapter's financial needs.

I am stepping down as Treasurer as of the March meeting. I've held the office for 10 years, and it's time for someone else to take over. And my living so far from Austin also makes it impossible for me to handle some of the Treasurer responsibilities. Milli Pope has been working with me this past year to be ready to assume the office. I'm very pleased that Milli agreed to be my replacement. I know she'll do an exceptional job. She is setting up a process for members to pay online, and we've been looking at ways for our funds to grow more.

The change in banks means changes in how we do some things—especially how checks are made out. But we'll have details later.

I've been honored to be your Treasurer for so long and appreciate the trust you've had in me. I know everyone will be equally supportive of Milli as she transitions into the office of Treasurer.

The legal entry of Texas into the Union was December 29, 1845. However, being the independent-minded people that they were, the Texans waited until the last possible moment.

Formal authority was transferred on February 19, 1846, which later became the cut-off date for eligible DRT ancestors.

#### **Mini Potato Gratin Stacks**

## **INGREDIENTS**

For 6 mini potato stacks



- 2/3 cup melted butter
- 1 heaping tablespoon dried herbs mix
- 1 silicone muffin mold or 1 buttered metal muffin mold

#### STFP 1

Peel the potatoes and rinse them well.

Cut the potatoes into super thin slices using a mandoline slicer.

#### STFP 3

Put the sliced potatoes in a bowl and season with salt.

### STEP 4

Add 34 of the melted butter and the dried herbs.

## STFP 5

Mix well using your hands.

Fill the muffin mold with the potato slices.

## STFP 7

Pack them well and add more slices if needed.

Add the rest of the melted butter.

## STFP 9

Cook the stacks in a pre-heated oven at 350 degrees for about 40 minutes.

(You can even add some cheese on top!)
